




On Sri Lanka's sun-baked south coast near the fishing town of Tangalle, Amanwella lies amid 37 acres of coconut trees next to a perfect crescent of golden sand. Combining modernist lines and indigenous materials, guest suites are inspired by the work of famed Sri Lankan architect Geoffrey Bawa; flooded with light, they each open on two sides to private plunge pools and large terraces overlooking the Indian Ocean. Away from the palm-shaded private beach club and the 47-metre pool, the area's diverse attractions – from tea plantations to treks and temple visits – capture Sri Lanka at its most authentic.

Location

- Amanwella lies on Sri Lanka's quiet southern coast, around 80km east of Galle (home to Amangalla) and 190km south of the capital, Colombo
- The seaside town of Tangalle is Amanwella's nearest community, around 3.5km east along the coast

Getting There

- Amanwella is served by Colombo's Bandaranaike International Airport
- From the airport, guests can journey 50 minutes by air taxi to Dickwella, a 20-minute drive from the property
- Amanwella can also arrange car transfers from Colombo



Accommodation

Identical in design and layout, Amanwella's terracotta-roofed suites feature hand-hewn stone walls and terrazzo floors, with floor-to-ceiling glass and lattice panels opening on two sides to a private courtyard, a terrace and a six-metre pool. Ocean Suites are located closer to the beach and enjoy magnificent views. Large sliding wooden screens divide the airy interiors into a combined sleeping and living room and a sumptuous bathroom. Some of the suites can be connected to accommodate larger groups or families.

Dining

The Restaurant

Capacity: 45 indoors, 36 on the terrace

- Open for breakfast, lunch and dinner
- Raised eight metres above sea level, with beautiful views across the pool to the beach
- Features a grassy inner courtyard landscaped with frangipani trees and reflection ponds
- Asian and Mediterranean cuisine with an emphasis on fresh local seafood

Lounge Bar

Capacity: 55 seated indoors, 10 seated outdoors

- Open 10am to 11pm for drinks, along with lunch, afternoon tea and dinner
- Relaxed venue by the restaurant, sharing its terrace and panoramic views
- Serves drinks, snacks and cigars

Pool Terrace

- Open for lunch and dinner
- An ideal spot for dining alfresco, furnished with daybeds and loungers

- Serves simple lunches alongside fresh coconut and fruit
- By night, guests can dine on antipasti and homestyle dishes

Beach Club

Capacity: 40 seated

- An alternative venue for lunch and private dinners
- Located close to the beachfront, surrounded by coconut palms
- The menu features Asian salads, Mediterranean classics and homemade ice creams
- Seafood is cooked over a coconut-charcoal grill, accompanied by garden-fresh salads and local relishes



Other Facilities

Library

• Stocked with a variety of reference books on Sri Lanka, along with novels, magazines, newspapers, CDs and games

Boutique

 Offers a rich selection of traditional handicrafts, from jewellery to textiles and antiques

Relaxation and Fitness

Spa

- The spa menu includes healing massages, traditional therapies, facials and body treatments
- All-natural ingredients are created from the cornucopia of herbs, plants and flowers on Amanwella's doorstep
- Treatments can be enjoyed at the spa or in-suite
- Yoga can be practised on a platform by the beach, along with guided meditation sessions



Activities & Excursions

Beaches

- Amanwella's 800-metre beach is ideal for snorkelling in winter, when the waters are calm; balmy onshore breezes cool sunbathers and walkers in summer
- Nearby beaches offer exceptional surfing conditions in summer; Amanwella can arrange one-to-one lessons with experienced local surfers

Village nature walks

- Take an early-morning or evening stroll through nearby Wella Wathuara village, and gain an insight into daily life in the region
- Paths wind through the jungle, revealing a variety of local wildlife including monkeys, birds, deer, monitor lizards, hares and mongooses

Tangalle

• The fishing town's bustling market is ideal for photography excursions

Whales, dolphins and turtles

• An hour's drive west, Mirissa Bay is renowned for its whale and dolphin sightings, and boat trips can be arranged through Amanwella Turtles nest at a number of protected beaches close to Amanwella; when hatching takes place, guests can witness baby turtles heading towards the sea by moonlight

Mulgirigala rock temple

- 25 minutes north of Tangalle, this monastic site perches on a rock at the top of a flight of 500odd steps
- It is the site where the Tika ola leaf scripts were discovered in the 19th century, offering a key to the translation of the Mahavamsa, Sri Lanka's ancient text

National parks

- Around 1.5 hours northeast of Tangalle, coastal Bundala national park attracts huge numbers of migratory birds in winter, along with elephants and crocodiles
- Two hours northeast of Tangalle, the vast Udawalawe national park is famed for its birdlife and elephants – often seen in herds of 100 or more
- Yala national park lies 2.5 hours northeast of Amanwella and boasts one of the highest populations of leopard in the world
